This Week In History: Operation DESERT STORM & The ACM LTVA-7E Corsair II

On loan to Air Classics from the National Naval Aviation Museum, our Corsair II was delivered to the Navy in 1973. Throughout its service life it was based at Naval Air Station Cecil Point,

Jacksonville, FL, serving with several VA (Fixed Wing, Attack)

squadrons. Our ship wears the markings of VA-72, known as the Bluehawks. VA-72 and its sister squadron, VA-46, were the last two active-duty US Navy A-7 squadrons and both participated in Operation DESERT



SHIELD and DESERT STORM in 1991. Operating from the USS John F. Kennedy (CV-67), our Corsair II played a part in the successful aerial campaign that made possible an



overwhelmingly powerful 100hour ground war that devastated Iraqi forces and restored Kuwaiti sovereignty.

When the USS Kennedy returned from its DESERT STORM combat cruise, both A-7 squadrons were stood down and the aircraft were sent to a well-earned retirement at NAS Millington, TN.
