Featured Exhibit: North American T-39 Sabreliner

North American designed the Sabreliner to meet the USAF UTX (Utility Trainer Experimental) requirement in 1956 and the first prototype flew in September 1958. The Air Force afterward ordered the T-39A, which used two Pratt & Whitney J60-P-3 turbojets, each rated at 3,000 lbs. of thrust. The aircraft was placed in service in a variety of roles; VIP transport, radar systems trainer for the F-105D Thunderchief, electronic warfare crew trainer for the F-105G, and bombardier/navigator trainer. The Sabreliner was also sold as a civil transport.
