Featured Exhibit: McDonnell-Douglas F-4B Phantom II

The McDonnell Douglas F-4B Phantom II is a tandem two-seat, twin-engine, all-weather, long-range supersonic jet interceptor and fighter-bomber originally developed for the United States Navy. Highly adaptable, it first entered service in 1961 and was later adopted by the United States

Marine Corps. By the mid-1960s it had become a major part of both service's air arms. Ever improved variants of the Phantom were produced until 1981. A total of 5,195 aircraft were built, making it the most produced American supersonic military aircraft in history.



The Phantom is a large fighter with a top speed of over Mach 2.2 and can carry more than 18,000 pounds of weapons including air-to-air missiles, air-to-ground missiles, and various bombs. Beginning in 1959, it

set 15 world records for in-flight performance, including an absolute speed record and an absolute altitude record.

The F-4 was used extensively during the Vietnam War, during which one U.S. Air Force pilot, two weapon systems officers (WSOs), one U.S. Navy pilot and one radar intercept officer (RIO) became aces by achieving five aerial kills against enemy fighter aircraft. The F-4 continued to form a major part of U.S. military air power throughout the 1970s and 1980s, being gradually replaced by more modern aircraft.

The Museum's example wears the Vietnam-era markings of VMFA-531, ("Grey Ghosts") which became the first land-based Marine Squadron to deploy to South Vietnam in 1965.
